INSTRUCTIONS FOR CERTIFICATE OF MAILING OBJECTION AND NOTICE OF HEARING

The purpose of this form is to provide verification to the court that you or your attorney mailed a copy of your objection and the notice of hearing to the guardian/conservator, attorney, and all interested persons.


HEADING

- i. Enter the county where the action is filed.
- ii. Enter the case number assigned by the clerk of the court.
- iii. Enter the name of the ward/minor ward/protected person.




BODY OF FORM

- a. TO THE GUARDIAN AND/OR CONSERVATOR OR THEIR ATTORNEY: You need to complete the Certificate of Mailing form and file it with the court showing that you mailed the required documents to the guardian/conservator, attorney, and all interested persons.
 - i. Enter the date you are swearing that you filed the required forms and mailed the copies to the required recipients.



ii. List the guardian/conservator, attorney, and all of the interested persons* and their addresses on the lines provided.




iii. <u>IF</u> there are more names and addresses for the required recipients than the spaces on the form provide room for, check the box next to "See Attached" and attach a sheet with the name and address of each additional person.



a. SIGNATURE SECTION

- i. The objector will sign their name
- ii. Enter the date.
- iii. Print the objector's name.
- iv. Enter the objector's street address.
- v. If this form is completed by an attorney, there is a space for the bar number and firm name
- vi. Enter the city, state, and zip code of the objector's address.
- vii. Enter the objector's telephone number with area code.
- viii. Enter the email address.



- * Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 30-2601, interested persons are defined as:
 - children and spouses;
 - future heirs if the ward/incapacitated person/protected person would die without leaving a valid will (brothers and sisters who are adults, grandparents, etc.);
 - a trustee of any trust executed by the ward/incapacitated person/protected person;
 - if there are no individuals defined as "interested persons" above, include any person or organization named as a "devisee" in the ward's/incapacitated person's/protected person's most recent will;
 - after death of the ward/incapacitated person/protected person, interested person also includes the personal representative of a deceased ward's/incapacitated person's/ protected person's estate, the deceased ward's/incapacitated person's/protected person's heirs in an intestate estate, and the deceased ward's/incapacitated person's/protected person's devisees in a testate estate;
 - any governmental agency paying benefits on behalf of the ward/incapacitated person/protected person; and
 - any person designated by order of the court to be an interested person.
